After lunch, guests are invited to a two-and-a-half-hour walking tour along Victory Avenue (Calea Victoriei), with visual visits to the Coral Temple, Stavropoleos Monastery, the Royal Palace of Bucharest, and the Romanian Athenaeum.

In the next days, participants will have the opportunity to take part in a thematic cultural excursion connected to the conference topic, “Multiculturality in Romania. Past and Present.” The tour will include visits to some of Romania’s most significant cultural and historical landmarks, offering insight into the country’s diverse heritage and intercultural legacy.

The itinerary includes Curtea de Argeș, renowned for its historic monastery and royal significance; Bran Castle, one of the most iconic medieval landmarks in Eastern Europe; the fortified church of Prejmer, a UNESCO World Heritage Site reflecting the Transylvanian Saxon tradition; the historic center of Brașov and the famous Black Church, representative of the region’s Gothic heritage; and Sinaia, where participants will visit the royal residences of Peleș and Pelicor Castles, remarkable examples of Romanian royal architecture and history.
