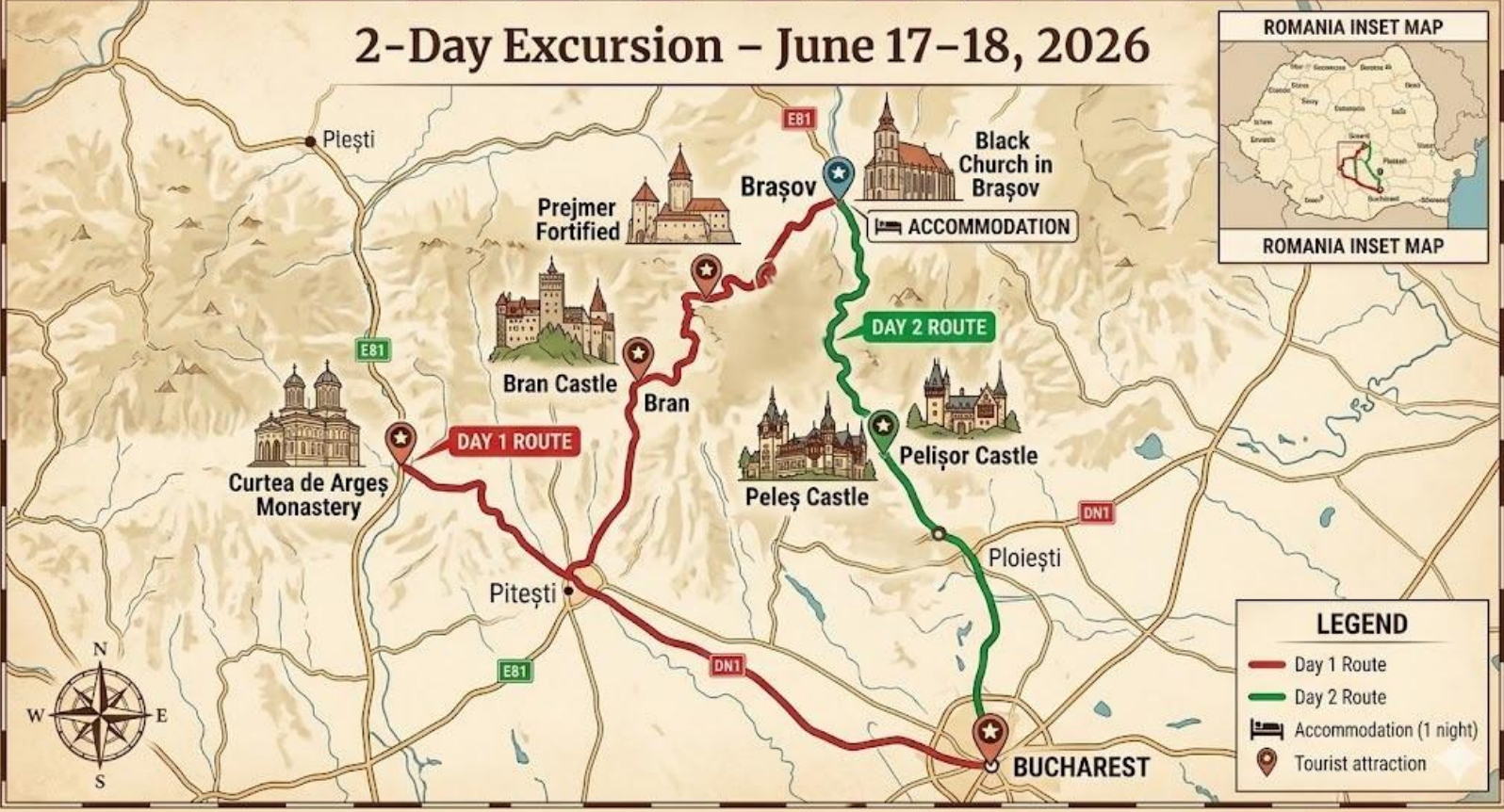

Programme Overview

As part of the conference, participants are invited to join a **two-day cultural programme** designed to provide an immersive exploration of Romania’s **multicultural heritage, historical transformations, and symbolic landscapes**.

The itinerary brings together sites of **religious significance, medieval architecture, and royal heritage**, offering a contextual understanding of the coexistence of diverse cultural, ethnic, and religious communities in Romania.

Day 1 – Bucharest → Curtea de Argeş → Bran → Prejmer → Braşov

	<p> Curtea de Argeş Monastery</p> <p>A major spiritual and historical landmark (1515–1517), representative of Byzantine architectural tradition and central to the development of Romanian cultural identity.</p> <p> Ticket: ~30 lei (~7 EUR)</p>
	<p> Bran Castle (Dracula’s Castle)</p> <p>A medieval fortified structure (attested in 1377), associated with both regional defensive systems and the global cultural narrative of the “Dracula” myth, illustrating the interplay between history and cultural imagination.</p> <p> Ticket: ~90 lei (~18 EUR)</p>
 <p>EN: The drawing in red represents buildings that do no more exist DE: Die Zeichnung in Rot stellt abgerissene Gebäude dar RO: Clădirile cu nuanțe de roșu nu mai există</p> <p>Tartlau (Prejmer)</p>	<p> Prejmer Fortified Church</p> <p>A UNESCO-listed site (13th century), originally Catholic and later Lutheran, exemplifying the Transylvanian Saxon heritage and the defensive ecclesiastical architecture characteristic of Central and Eastern Europe.</p> <p> Ticket: ~25 lei (~5 EUR)</p>
	<p> Braşov – Multicultural Old Town</p> <p>A historical city shaped by Romanian, German (Saxon), and Hungarian communities, offering a paradigmatic example of urban multicultural coexistence.</p> <p>The programme includes:</p>



- Guided walking tour of the historical centre (Piaţa Sfatului)
- Visit to the **Black Church** (15th century Gothic monument), emblematic of the Saxon cultural legacy
